Artist of the Month

Cynthia Bell

I first picked up pastel sticks to turn a failed watercolor painting into a passable mixed media work. That painting was beyond help, but I discovered a new world of possibilities with pastel. I enjoy working in pastel because it's a very versatile medium. It presents the best of both worlds because one can choose to draw, paint, or combine both drawing and painting in a single piece. It's a very tactile medium, which is gratifying because there's an immediate connection to the work as I apply strokes of color.

I've studied with local artists including the late Lynne Meleleu, Lori Jeremiah, Wanita Paolino, and at the Attleboro Arts Museum. In addition, I was fortunate to take a workshop with Jacob Aguiar, a rising star in the national pastel scene. Pastel is a forgiving medium and feels so natural to me, that it's not intimidating to experiment on my own and teach myself.

Spring Burst is based on a photo I took at my in-laws' farm in Exeter, RI and is done on sanded paper. The painting started as an experiment. I had assigned myself what was supposed to be a simple, short exercise to loosen up. I had no expectations; surprisingly, it evolved into a fully finished work.
