

**Entry Fee**: \$5.00 per entry **Number of pieces**: 2

Size: No more than 105 inches total perimeter, including frame. All art must be framed with wire, ready to hang. Wire should be tight and approximately 1/3 down from the top of the frame with preferably flat hangers. No saw-toothed hangers. Unframed, gallery-wrapped canvas must be a minimum of 1-1/2" deep. Matted works, cards, etc. may be brought to opening and placed in bins, but must be taken home at end of evening. Sold pieces are subject to club commission -10%.

**Liability:** Entries are submitted at your own risk. While all art is handled with care, neither the East Greenwich Art Club, its members, or the Warwick Library is responsible for any lost or damaged art.

# **Artist Statement**

I have taken photos for many years as a hobby but became more seriously involved at retirement. As a result, I became a member of the Wickford Art Association and the East Greenwich Art Club. My primary interest is taking unusual pictures. It may be the subject itself, angles, focus or perception.

I don't focus on any one type of subject because good opportunities to photograph interesting subjects appear in many different places. It doesn't make any difference where you are in the world, the seashore, the mountains, your backyard, a street corner or in the city you'll find exciting scenes to capture but you must use your imagination to create an unusual picture.

My pictures span a variety of experiences such as the excitement of seeing a wave break in unusual patterns, the solitude of a fence in the winter, peering out a kitchen window or seeing an empty but stately dining room. To some the forest looks like trees and fields but to me as a photographer the forest is alive with colors, movement, darkness and sometimes neglect, therefore, these are the things I try to capture. So, in my pictures I portray not only those things that I see but also what I feel about the image in my lens.
